Completing your application

Please read the International Application Form guidelines before completing your application and make sure you complete all sections of the form.

Once you have completed your application form you can either submit it directly to the Admissions Team or the Northumbria University Regional Office responsible for your country (see page 59 for details).

Please ensure you include all supporting documents with your application, as indicated in the International Application Form guidelines.

What happens next?

Once we receive your fully completed application form and supporting documents, you should receive our decision within a few weeks by email, this will include any outstanding conditions that you will need to meet to satisfy the requirements for your unconditional offer.

Accepting your offer

To accept your offer you should complete and return an Offer Acceptance Form, and, unless your fees are being paid by a recognised financial sponsor, you will also need to pay a deposit and send us your Deposit Payment Form. Applicants who pay their deposit in full before advertised deadlines may also be entitled to an Early Payment Discount. Information regarding these discounts will be detailed in the offer email that we send you but you can also find out more, including Terms and Conditions, by visiting **northumbria.ac.uk/pathway-terms**

If your offer is conditional, please send us evidence that you have met the conditions of your offer as soon as possible so that we can confirm your place on your course.

Applying for a Visa

If you are coming to study a full-time course in the UK, it may be necessary for you to obtain a Tier 4 (General) Student visa. You can find out more about this at **ukvisas.gov.uk**



In order to apply for a Tier 4 visa, you will need a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), which you can request on your Offer Acceptance Form once you have satisfied all conditions and paid any necessary deposit. We will email your CAS letter to the email address you have supplied on your application form. Please note, in order for you to receive your CAS in time for your visa application and the start of your course, you will need to send your offer acceptance and CAS request to us by the advertised deadlines on our website.

If you require a Tier 4 visa for studying on your new course, you must inform us of any previous Tier 4 (General) Student visas that you have held. If you are currently in the UK, you will also be required to provide a copy of your current visa. This is so we can establish whether we need to confirm on your CAS that your new course represents academic progression or complements previous studies. It will also allow us to check that you have enough time left under Tier 4 in order to complete your new course.

Deadlines

We strongly recommend that you apply as early as possible to allow enough time to complete all the preparations you need to make in order to study in the UK. After receiving an offer it can take several months to arrange your finances and apply for a visa and it is important that you arrive in good time for our international enrolment session.

Northumbria University Library is one of the best academic libraries in the UK, and has held the Government Customer Service Excellence (CSE) accreditation since 2010.

Our libraries provide extensive print and electronic collections of scholarly resources, including:

- around **half a million** print books,
- nearly **843,000** electronic books,
- extensive collection of more than **83,000** print and electronic journals,
- over **100** subscribed scholarly resources, including databases, collections of early historical books and primary digital archives.

The City Campus Library is open and staffed 24/7 in term time, while Coach Lane Library and the Law Practice Library also offer extensive opening hours.

The Library's learning and research spaces are designed to meet the needs of students, with all three libraries providing places to read, think, write, focus, collaborate, and be inspired.

The Library's Northumbria Skills Programme is designed to support you to become an effective, independent scholar, providing comprehensive advice and guidance on a variety of learning skills, including academic reading and writing, literature searching and referencing.

Money matters

Cost is an important factor for most students and we fully appreciate what a big investment you are making in your future. We also have a number of measures in place to help make your study more affordable.

As an international student you can save money on our undergraduate and postgraduate degrees by paying early. In addition, our undergraduate tuition fees are frozen from your start date, meaning you will know exactly how much your full course will cost with no inflationary increases in subsequent years. If you decide to go on to study at postgraduate-level, either immediately or in the future, you will benefit from our Alumni Discount where we reduce your postgraduate tuition fee by 20%.

Scholarships and discounts

The Northumbria University Bursary and Scholarship packages will provide financial help to a wide range of students, including rewarding high-achieving students and supporting those with an 'overseas' fee status. All Scholarships and Bursaries awarded by the University are support that does not need to be paid back.

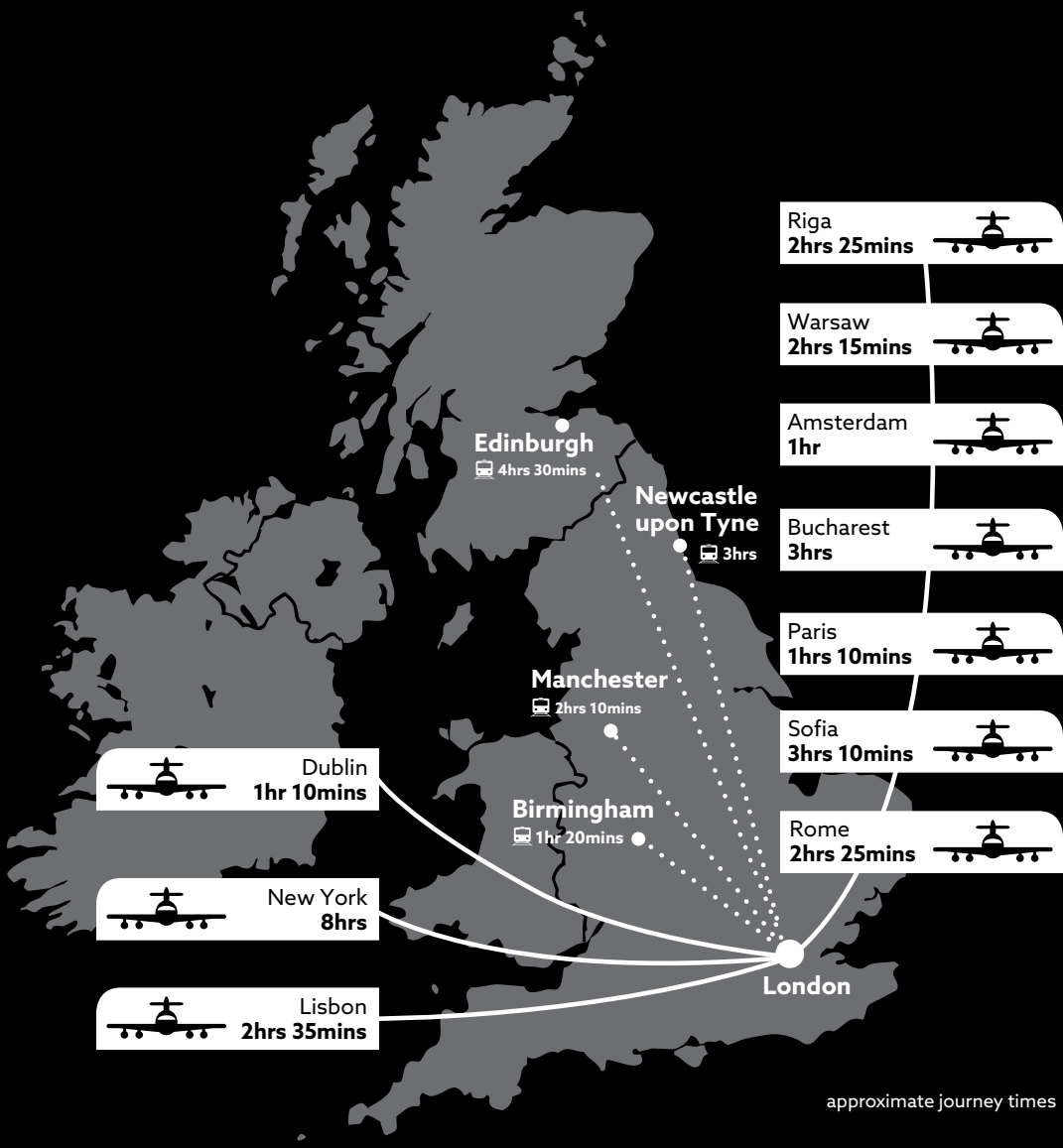
