
WELCOME TO NORTHUMBRIA



We have several options for your child to choose from when studying with us, including International Foundation Programmes and International Year One. Each of these programmes have different entry requirements and your child can choose which is most suitable for them.

International Foundation Programmes

Our International Foundation Programmes are a degree preparation programme aimed at students who want to study an undergraduate degree, but don't quite have the right entry requirements to gain direct entry to their chosen degree programme. We have 6 exciting pathway courses that offer your child the route to progress onto one of over 90 undergraduate degrees offered at Northumbria University.

International Year One


Our International Year One course is a degree preparation programme for students who want to study a business degree, but don't quite have the right entry requirements to gain direct entry into a year one undergraduate course.

This course offers:

- Progression to Northumbria University's double AACSB-accredited Business School
- Equivalent to year one of an undergraduate degree
- More support and teaching hours than a standard first year undergraduate degree
- Opportunities to build intercultural skills and integrate with UK student life
- A specialist module applicable to your child's target degree
- Completion of the degree in 3 years (4 years with a work placement year)

Upon successful completion, and subject to specific requirements, students will be guaranteed a place on the second year of an undergraduate degree at Northumbria University.

All pathway programmes are taught at the City Campus. Our Coach Lane Campus has excellent computing and library services, its own modern Students' Union, and new sports facilities.

Campus Facilities

Our campuses have a wide range of facilities for our students to enjoy. We know how important it is, as a parent, that you know exactly what is available on campus for your child.

As well as our classrooms, clinics, labs and studios, we have a wide array of learning spaces available where students can meet, study and collaborate.

Our University Library is one of the best academic libraries in the UK and has around half a million print books, over 900,000 e-books and around 85,000 e-journals. We also have plenty of study spaces, digital hubs and outdoor spaces across the campus.

All our catering and retail outlets serve hot and cold food – which can even be preordered via an app. Sport Central, our sports facility, has a gym and swimming pool. Students can enjoy a wide range of online workouts to do at home too!

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

Ask4Help Desks

Our Ask4Help service desks are based in student central locations on campus and are available 24/7 during term-time. They are the first point of contact for all student support enquiries. Contactable in person, by phone or via their portal, our team will ensure your child receives all the support they need during their studies.

Learning Coaches

Upon commencing their studies, every student is assigned a learning coach who serves as their primary point of contact. Our learning coaches provide valuable guidance, helping students understand what to expect when living in the UK and providing ongoing support throughout their academic journey.

Our dedicated learning coaches are also here to support with any challenges encountered during the enrolment process and will make sure your child is enrolled onto their chosen course smoothly.

SafeZone App

Northumbria University has a SafeZone app and we recommend that all students download it for free onto their phone. The app makes it easy for our students to contact university security or the emergency services. The app has three main features which can be accessed at the tap of a button: emergency assistance, first aid and general help.

Security officers are dispatched for all emergency and first aid requests, whilst the general help button connects directly to the Campus Services Helpdesk. Students can also check in to make security aware of their location.

Accommodation

At Northumbria, there are range of options available with guaranteed accommodation for all our students. We have a variety of different accommodation including ensuite rooms and catered accommodation, with all bills included and no hidden costs.

Your child can book their accommodation as soon as they make Northumbria their firm choice and can pick their exact room. The whole process can be completed easily and online in minutes, and you can rest assured knowing your child has a secure place to live on arrival in the UK.

For your peace of mind, we have on-site support, maintenance and security teams to ensure your child can experience university life, safely. Our accommodation offers great social spaces to relax, study and have fun within an exclusive student community.

All our residences are within walking distance of the campus and are easily accessed through local transport links. We also have NU emergency accommodation reserved for under 18 students to make sure the safety of our students.

LIVING IN THE UK

When your child moves to the UK to commence their studies, it is important that they are aware of certain restrictions and things to consider to ensure their transition is as smooth as possible.

Medical Support

Once your child is in the UK, they will be required to registered with a local doctor (GP) to look after current or future health needs. Your child's GP practice is the first port of call for most of their health needs both physical and mental.

Students Under 18

There are certain legal requirements in the UK for people who are under 18. They might not be able to experience fully the social aspects of studying in the UK as it is against the law for individuals under the age of 18 to purchase alcohol and tobacco or have someone purchase it on their behalf. The university safeguards students under the age of 18 as best as they can.

Personal Safety

It is important for your child to be mindful of personal safety, especially in a large and unfamiliar city. In the UK we have a wide range of emergency services available to contact 24/7 on the following numbers:

- Police/Ambulance/Fire service dial 999
- For fast medical help, that it is not an emergency dial 111

Before Arrival

In the UK some things may be slightly different to at home. We have put together some helpful information about things to consider before your child arrives in the UK.

Organise a visa: to study in the UK, your child will need to register for a visa. You can find out more by visiting: **gov.uk/student-visa**

Open a UK bank account: as part of some visa conditions, a UK bank account is required. This will also make life easier when living in the UK and it'll allow your child to get paid should they get a part-time job. It's a good idea to check if your current bank has any business relationships with UK banks. It's important to remember, you may need to present recent bank statements and/or your proof of scholarship letter, it's a good idea to have some photocopies of these.

Check the course entry requirements: different courses have different entry requirements; it is important you are aware of the requirements set out by the university before your child applies and have certificates and other documents supporting your child's education history and English language testing (IELTS). Check course fees: before your child commits to studying at university, be aware of the course fees and payment deadlines, these change per year. Full information can be found here: **pathway.northumbria.ac.uk/dates-and-fees**

Gather relevant documents and paperwork: before arrival, your child must have a valid and in date passport, a valid visa, proof of medical screenings (if required) and medication prescriptions (if required). Have photocopies of these to hand, just in case.

Budgeting

The UK is currently experiencing an inflation on living costs, resulting in higher-than-expected costs for some daily necessities. It is important to budget for your child's time in the UK and ensure they have enough income to cover university costs, as well as living expenses. You will also need to consider the exchange rate from your home currency into British Sterling (pounds) which is used across the UK.

The UK has a wide range of budget retailers from supermarkets to clothes shops, to homeware department stores to discount chains. It's good to remember that many stores offer additional discounts with a student card. Our Student Support teams are on hand to help our students with budgeting, offering helpful advice on money management and how to make your cash go further.

Culture Shock

FINANCE INFORMATION

When coming to study in the UK, there are some financial implications that come along with it. It is important that you check the tuition fees for the course your child has chosen to study, as these vary between programmes and academic years.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fees for the academic year 23/24 range from £11,000 to £20,500, depending on the course length. Fees for the subsequent academic year are expected to slightly increase due to inflation. Our most up to date course fee information can be found on our website.

Scholarships and Bursaries



Secure Payment Methods

We offer one of the safest methods for making your child's tuition payments. Our payment method, in partnership with Flywire, allows you to make education payments in your own currency, removing the need to convert your currency before making a payment. APPLICATION INFORMATION

How to Apply

Applying to study with us is easy. We have set out all the information you need ahead of applying on our website. We strongly recommend that students submit their application as early as possible to allow them to complete all the preparations needed to study in the UK.

Visa Process

To live and study in the UK, students must apply for a Tier 4 (General) Student Visa. Subject to requirements, individuals who hold a Tier 4 Visa can work up to 20 hours per week during term time, and full-time during off-term time.

Course Entry Requirements

Entry requirements vary depending on the course. It is important that your child has the correct entry requirements (or equivalent) when applying for their chosen course.

Guardianship

The UKVI require an original (not electronic) signature from a parent/legal guardian in order for students under the age of 18 to travel to and study in the UK.

Our recruitment team will request this before the offer to commence studies is confirmed.





TOP TIPS FOR PARENTS

We have put together some of our top tips, to help you ensure your child has a smooth transition to university life.

Important Information

Make sure your child adds Northumbria University to their contacts, this will ensure our emails don't disappear into their junk mailbox, and no key information will be missed.

Encourage your child to attend one of our NU Experience days. Information will be sent via email, once they have been made an offer.

Before Moving

Check what your chosen accommodation provides before buying some essential household items. Some items may come with the accommodation and many can be bought on arrival into the UK. It is important to note what size bedding is needed for their new accommodation too.

It is important to remember, UK electrical plugs are different and a UK adapter will be required for your child to use appliances/electrician brought from home.

Check your child has packed some of their favourite things to ensure their new room is a home from home! And most importantly, remember to make a note of the date your child can move into their new accommodation - to ensure it doesn't clash with any holidays or key dates.

Becoming a Student

When your child becomes a student, it is important they register at a GP near to their new home. They will also need to buy a TV license for their new accommodation if they are planning to watch live TV and use TV catch-up platforms.

Most importantly, stay calm and enjoy the process. Your child is about to embark on an exciting new adventure. The university is here to support you and your child throughout their transitions to university and whilst they are studying with us.
